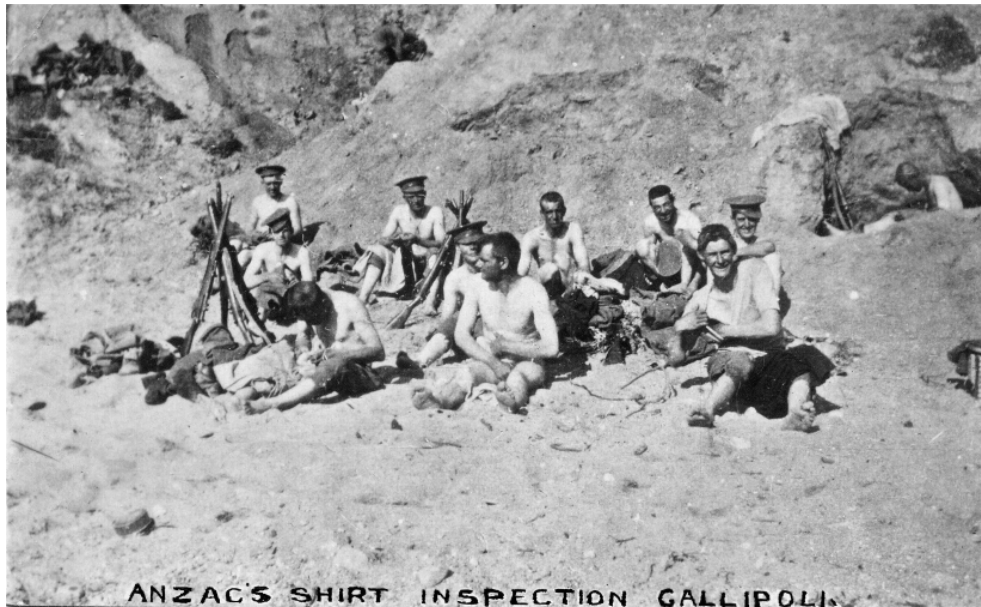


View of Sea Shore from Mount Lavinia looking towards Colombo.
